

Service Committee is focu<mark>sed on our place in the communit</mark>y, reaching out to our neighbors to help provide for their needs.

We are currently doing this in many ways:

Mission Food Pantry; in 2020 we delivered 25 pallets containing 1200 boxes of vegetables, 20 boxes of frozen whole chickens, and 35 gallons of milk as part of the Ecumenical National Farmers to Families program. We continue to bring food and \$ to help feed the hungry.

Mission in Mission and Mission Service Project; we work with other churches, primarily those in other parts of the country to do building projects in neighborhoods outside the Mission Area, but within 20 miles.

Su Casa de Esperanza; members and friends have brought clothing and blankets, for the children at Su Casa.

Presbyterian Giving Catalog; we continue to collect coins to help the global mission of the Presbyterian Church.

But, we know we can do better. Service is planning to resume our Vital Congregations project with hopes to complete the process by the end of the year to determine how we serve 3 distinct communities: Our traditional families in Mission; Winter Texans in their retirement communities; and the Bi-lingual families that live a few blocks from the church.

Vital Congregations process will include:

A sermon series on the 7 Marks of a vital congregation

A bible study series on the 7 Marks of a vital congregation.

Visits with individuals in each of our 3 chosen "Neighborhoods" (Neighborhood "Exegesis") to determine what their needs are, and to incorporate those needs in our plans for the future, our "Mission Plan."

One Brief time of looking back at where we have come from in 1910 to today, how vital we are, and how things have changed, and continue to change.

The committee cannot do this alone. We need help. Perhaps Nurture, which focuses on caring for who we are, now, can help with the needs of the existing members and Winter Texans? If we are to become a truly Vital Congregation, we need to include as many people as possible in this process, as we move and change with God's Holy Spirit to be the congregation God calls us to be, and our Neighbors need us to be.

WORSHIP

The Worship Committee met May 22, 2021 and have made the recommendation that we begin in person worship every Sunday beginning June 6, 2021 with masks and social distancing required for attendance with only one worship service beginning at 10:30 a.m. in the sanctuary. Offering will be collected at the door before and after worship service. On June 6, 2021 we will be having communion service for which a juice/wafer cup will be provided or if you prefer you may bring your own from home. After the service, the Garden area will be available for socializing.

In-person Worship

Welcome to Worship

June 6 is an exciting day in the life of the church. We will begin in-person worship in the Sanctuary on that day, while we continue to live- stream on YouTube and offer recorded worship on both YouTube and Facebook.

For those attending in person, please know that we will be practicing CDC guidelines:

- Masks will be worn at all times in the Sanctuary.
- 6' distancing will be practiced (Those who live together, or arrive together can sit together).
- Visiting will be restricted to the outdoor areas. The Garden is a great place to visit.
- No coffee or donuts will be served in the narthex, since we will not be gathering there to visit.
- The parlor and nursery remain closed at this time.
- We will not use bulletins, hymnals or pew bibles. Everything will be projected on the large screen displays in the font of the sanctuary. This change may not be temporary.
- Offering may be given when you come in or leave. We will not pass the plates during worship.
- Communion Elements may be brought from home, or picked up in the narthex as you arrive to worship.
- . We will be limiting the duration of worship, and will have limited singing.

Those who gather together will experience a closer physical connection, and those who continue to participate via YouTube and Facebook will have a similar to improved worship experience compared to services prior to this day.

Much work has been done by many people to make in-person worship possible, even while we live-stream. There have been lots of technology hurdles to overcome to wirelessly incorporate the large video screens and adapt our streaming software to use the Sanctuary PA system. All these hurdles have been overcome, and we owe a debt of thanks to those who have run the gauntlet; Lowell Hudsonpillar, Alex Macias, and their large portfolio of technology gurus in the community.

Please, patiently bear with us as we take baby steps into our future while our community slowly recovers from the COVID-19 Pandemic.



Looking back (I prefer to look forward), I recall that our 2014 budget was \$304,736. Expenses have been cut dramatically in the last 7 years to balance spending with reduced giving. In 2019, our last full year before the pandemic, our expenses were \$261,380, while regular giving was \$206,915, with the difference filled by transfers from our Continuing Mission Fund Reserves, and other Reserve funds.

In 2020, the first year of the COVID-19 Pandemic, our expenses were reduced to \$242,243, and giving declined to \$136,791. The shortfall was filled by a \$27,800 PPP loan, which has since been forgiven, \$30,000 transferred from the Continuing Mission Fund Reserves, plus other transfers and special giving received, including a grant of \$1,000 from Mission Presbytery.

In 2021, with the retirements of Sue Leerhoff and Pat Hudsonpillar, and with only the pastor as paid staff, our projected 2021 Expense is reduced to \$155,000, and a run rate for a full year of about \$140,000. Projected giving this year is about \$150,000, which combined with the \$30,000 already transferred from the Continuing Mission Fund Reserves this year, will cover Current Run Rate Expenses, plus the Janitorial Expenses of \$875 per month beginning in June, and about \$2,000 per month for a part time office manager beginning in September or October.

Many of you have continued to pay your pledges during the Pandemic, and others have increased their giving to cover shortfalls. Your generosity and faithfulness has been a God-send during this time.

Looking forward to 2022, our run rate expense should be about, \$170,000 for the year, and current rate giving, plus the giving of those who only give when they attend worship, should cover that expense.

Because we have the Continuing Mission Fund to help us in times like these, and because the stock market increase has been so good over the last couple of years, the Total Continuing Mission Fund balance has not declined despite the \$60,000 transferred during the COVID Pandemic shortfalls. Sometime during the next year, we expect to add an additional \$125,000 to the Continuing Mission Fund due to the Generosity of the Russell Family who remembered the church in their Estate Plan. Please consider, in addition to tithing 10% of your income today to the general fund, also remembering the church in your Estate Plan, knowing that your generosity will help the church in the future through periodic difficult times like we have experienced in the past year.

Because of those who generously gave to the Continuing Mission Fund in the past, we emerge from the COVID-19 Pandemic stronger financially than we entered it.

There have ben some wonderful changes in the church brought about by the Pandemic that will continue to be

benefit the church for years to come, because of targeted investment in the present for our future.

We have converted our church membership and financial accounting system from ACS to ACS's lower cost and easier to use Realm system.

We have added Electronic Giving as a way to give. It may be used to give to the church on a one-time or continuing basis using either your checking account or credit card, the way people tend to do business these days. Electronic Giving links your giving to the Realm Accounting System by using your e-mail, if the same email you use for giving is also the one that is on file in Realm. Links to the Realm's secure, encrypted giving site for our church are found on our website (fpcmission.com) and on our Facebook page.

We made some investments in 2020 and more in 2021 to be able to stream our worship services on YouTube and make worship also accessible through Facebook. These investments include a laptop computer, a projector and conference room camera and area microphone system used in our streaming from March 2020 to May 2021. Additional investments were made in two large video screens, another laptop, enhanced wifi, new wireless microphones and PC connections to the sanctuary PA system to allow streaming and in-person worship to occur simultaneously beginning June 6, 2021.

We thank God for being with us through the COVID time of separation and for guiding us through the Session to emerge from the Pandemic to meeting in person, again. We also thank you for your patience through this time, as you have awaited the future together which begins now. In Christ, Eric.

Staff Task Force



Due to the Retirements of Sue Leerhoff at the end of January after 17 ½ years of faithful service and Pat Hudsonpillar at Easter after almost 29 years of service, the Session set up a Staff Task Force, headed by Shannon Perales to work on ways to continue the organized and efficient operation of the church with staff, volunteers and contact workers. Now, with only the pastor on staff, total staff expenses have been reduced by about \$90,000, which has helped us balance our budget for 2021.

Preliminary Results of the Task Force:

- 1. A Janitorial Service will begin work to clean the church facility at a cost of \$875 per month, including cleaning supplies.
- 2. Lawn Care will continue to be done by church volunteers.
- 3. A part-time Office manager will be hired in the Fall at a rate of \$15,000 to \$20,000 per year. Plans for this position will be finalized in August.
- 4.Office Volunteers will bridge the gap in office work between now and the Fall, and after that time, will work to supplement the work of our part-time office manager.
- 5.Worship Music will continue as-is, with paid accompanists and volunteer singers, with an occasional use of paid special music. Once it is time to have a choir again, session will consider a part-time, seasonal choir director.
- 6.Bell Choir Pat Hudsonpillar has volunteered to direct the Bell Choir from time to time.
- 7.At some point, a volunteer or part-time Family Ministry coordinator will be needed to coordinate children/youth/and family events including participation in worship leadership through song and play.

Looking forward to 2022:

The pastor will retire at the end of 2021. At a current cost of \$70,000 in expense, the Pastor is currently the lowest paid pastor among Presbyterian Pastors installed in the Valley, while First Presbyterian Church, Mission, TX continues to be the largest Presbyterian Church in the Valley. It is likely that when looking for a new pastor, the terms of call will need to be increased by \$20,000 to \$30,000 to be competitive with other congregations in the Valley and other areas. Please keep this in mind when considering your pledges for 2022.
